



MOTOCROSS REGULATION 2019

of Baltic Open Individual Championship

Motocross regulation (hereinafter referred to as Regulation) of Baltic Open Individual Championship (hereinafter referred to as Baltic Championship) define the procedures and principles according to which Motocross competitions shall be organised in Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania.

1. GENERAL RULES

1.1. This contest Regulation is based on the FIM (Federation Internationale Motocyclisme), FIM Europe (European Motorcycle Union) and FMN (National federations) Championships regulations, racing and technical terms, this statute and the individual championships in this part of stage race regulations, which must not be inconsistent with this regulation.

1.2. Organizer have to approved phase regulation in own federation and after that have to send it out for all other national federations, not later than two weeks before the race.

2. CHAMPIONSHIP MANAGEMENT

Championship organizers are Latvian Motorcyclists federation (LaMSF), Estonian Motorcycling federation (EMF) and Lithuanian Motorcycle Sport Federation (LMSF). All organizational issues related to the Baltic Championship lead (in case of ambiguities due to wording of Regulations or any errors are discovered) must be eliminated by Motocross Commissions of the Baltic Countries (Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania).

3. COMPETITION CALENDAR AND CLASSES

3.1. Baltic Championship take place in three stages according to the commonly approved racing calendar and classes:

- First stage – **6th of July, Parnu**, Estonia (MX1, MX2, MX85, MX125)
- First stage – **7th of July, Parnu**, Estonia (Quads, Sidecars)
- Second stage – **8th of September, Cēsis**, Latvia (MX1, MX2, MX85, MX125, Quads, Sidecars)
- Third stage – **14th of September, Utena**, Lithuania (MX85)
- Third stage – **15th of September, Utena**, Lithuania (MX1, MX2, MX125, Quads, Sidecars)



3.2. Ages of classes:

Class	Motorcycle	Age
MX 85	over 60cc up to 85cc 2 stroke or over 75cc up to 150cc 4 stroke	11 – 15 years
MX125	over 80cc up to 125cc 2 stroke or over 150cc up to 250cc 4 stroke	13 – 17 years
MX2	over 175cc up to 250cc 4 stroke or over 100cc up to 250cc 2 stroke	from 14 years
MX1	over 290cc up to 650cc 4 stroke or over 180cc up to 500cc 2 stroke	from 15 years
Quads	over 249cc	from 14 years
Sidecars	over 350cc up to 750cc 2 stroke or up to 1000cc 4 stroke with 1 or to cylinders	from 16 years riders and passengers

3.3. For classes MX85, MX125, MX2, MX1 and Sidecars the minimum age starts on the date of the rider's birthday and the maximum age finishes at the end of the calendar year in which the rider reaches the age of 15 for EMX85 and 17 for EMX125.

3.4. For class Quads the minimum age starts on the year of the rider's birthday.

4. AWARDING

4.1. All three races of the three Baltic Championship competitions will count towards the final standings.

4.2. Riders winning the 1st place of Baltic Championship win the title of Baltic Motocross champion of the current year.

4.3. Riders winning 1st, 2nd or 3rd places of Baltic Championship are awarded with gold, silver and bronze medals, cups and diplomas.

4.4. Winners of each stage (by class) are awarded according to competition regulations. Awards are presented at least to the first three places in each class (with cups).

4.5. Riders to be awarded must participate in the awarding ceremony.

4.6. Baltic Championship classes according to the place in total standings at the end of season receive money awards as follows (*Class/ Place/ Eur*):

- 4.6. The prize money for Baltic Championship will be awarded in the end of the season.
- 4.7. Each Federation is going to contribute € 3050 towards the budget of the Championship. € 450 of the funds will cover the cost of medals and cups and € 8700 of the funds will cover a prize money for all Baltic Championship classes according point 4.6.
- 4.8. Each competition organizer can set up own prize fund.
- 4.9. Awards ceremony at the end of season takes place every year in another country. This year awards ceremony will organize LaMSF.
